Joan's Jottings

Advent is upon us and the long heralded revised texts of the **Roman Missal** are now in effect. I pray you have kept up with the information about these texts that has been provided to you: the many articles in the Newsletters, bulletins, bulletin inserts, the informational meetings, and the pamphlet "**Understanding the Revised Mass Texts**" by Paul Turner. Faith Formation classes from K-12 have been studying these changes as well. It is going to take time for all of us to adjust and adapt. At times, it will be awkward and messy as all of us (priest and people) get used to unfamiliar language and phrasing and the singing of the various parts of the Mass. Please be sure to take a worship aid along with the hymnal when you enter church. It will help! One of the benefits of these changes, I believe, is that we will need to pay closer attention to what we are saying and doing and as a result, will be participating more actively in the worship of the Church.

We are also into a new Church Year and will be in the **B Cycle** of readings taken from the Gospel of Mark for the coming year. I hope each family is taking time to reflect on the readings from your *At Home with the Word* books that were given out in November. As well, the *Little Blue Books* for Advent are a wonderful way of celebrating the Advent and Christmas seasons.

The **Feast of the Immaculate Conception** is celebrated on Thursday, December 8th, and Masses are at 8:30am and 7:00pm.

Our **Advent Penance Services** are scheduled for **Wednesday, December 14th**, 11:30am and 7:00pm as well as regular individual confessions on Saturdays at 4:00pm. Please note that since Christmas is on a Sunday this year, there will be **NO** confessions on December 24th.

Our **Christmas Schedule for Masses** is:

Saturday, December 24, 4:00pm, 7:00pm and Midnight

Note: For the 4:00 Mass, the church doors will be opened at 3:15pm.

Sunday, December 25, 10:30am / no 8:30am Mass on Dec. 25

January 1, Mary, Holy Mother of God, regular weekend schedule: Dec. 31, 5:00pm;

Sunday, January 1st, 8:30am and 10:30am.

May we use these four weeks of Advent to prepare our hearts and our homes to celebrate the great mystery of the Word dwelling among us!

Blue Christmas:

Helping Hurting People Cope with the Holidays

Not everyone welcomes the Christmas season with joy. For people dealing with loss, sadness, grief, stress, or loneliness, the holidays can be a time of dread. The season rings hollow.

Stephen Ministry provides a powerful way to reach out to those who are struggling with pain and loss--during the Christmas season and throughout the year. A Stephen Minister comes alongside a hurting person to listen and care so that he or she does not have to face the darkness alone.

During this Christmas season, we can be especially aware of those who have suffered a loss during the past year. Let them know that you understand how difficult the holidays can be--and that our Stephen Ministers are available to provide the care and support they need.

Here is a letter from someone that was helped by the Series of Grief Booklets that can be a resource for ministering to those experiencing a loss at any time, but especially during the holidays:

Dear Jean,

I want to thank you for mailing the four books by Dr. Haugk. The fourth and final copy arrived today, almost one year after my wife entered the hospital following her fall, never to return to us in this life. The timing was very good. I needed the message of the book today.

I found these books and their message very helpful with coping with the death of (my wife). I had attended a grief support group at the VNA shortly after (her) passing, but I found little or no help there. Perhaps it was too soon after the event, or I was looking for sympathy rather than empathy, but I felt neither. I found both in Dr. Haugk's books.

Baptism

If parents are looking forward to having their child baptized here, please contact Sister Joan at 223-5500. Classes are scheduled when there are two or three families to prepare for baptism. Parents are encouraged to attend a class prior to the birth of their child.

After the initial meeting, a baptismal class is scheduled and then followed up by a meeting in the family home. This preparation includes the history of baptism, the meaning of the symbols of baptism, the role of sponsors, a book to be read and discussed by the parents prior to the home meeting. After this is completed, the baptismal date will be set. Baptisms are **not** celebrated during the season of Lent which begins February 22. 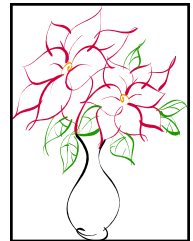

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

This adventure began three years ago with our Stewardship Committee's "Matthew's Talent." In this program, seed money was offered for parishioners to multiply by planning and hosting an event or activity which would be a fundraiser. The second and equally important objective was to offer an opportunity for building community within our faith community as well as with friends and neighbors in the Fairport and surrounding areas. I prayed to God for inspiration. He spoke to me and an idea was born: build community by setting up a craft sale which would engage parishioners and crafters from the surrounding areas and here in Fairport.

We recently completed our fourth craft sale FUNdraiser. Each year all of the tables have been rented (there is even a waiting list!), and the vendors keep coming back. A record number of over two hundred and fifty customers shopped at our sale. Most of the baked goods disappeared. A majority of our hot dogs and snacks were sold and enjoyed by shoppers, volunteers and vendors alike. Our good reputation of having quality items available has spread. This was our most successful craft sale to date.

This year's event was made possible because of support from the following people: * the staff - Sister Joan Cawley, Jan Harmon, Michelle Andrews-Smith, Cathy Reitz and Ed Dundas; * the Stewardship Committee - Paul Procaccini, Ed Giggie, Chuck Moynihan, John Costanza, Dave Large, Lisa Courtney-Holmes and Ed Dundas - provided promotional materials such as signs, posters and media ads, and also labor for setting up and dismantling the rooms and tables used that day, and assisting vendors; * several parishioners made the great variety of delicious baked goods; * Lisa Courtney-Holmes, her daughter Teagan, and sister Shannon LeBeau, managed and sold the baked goods. * Jean Tosch helped with selling tickets and counting customers; * Katherine Waldmiller and friends sold M&M raffle tickets; * vendors donated the raffle items; * Dave Large sold 50-50 tickets; * Bob Hinds helped all the way through this adventure; he is my sounding board and helper in all ways. I'd like to again express my heartfelt thanks to all who participated in this wonderful event. God answers our prayers; we just have to know where to look.

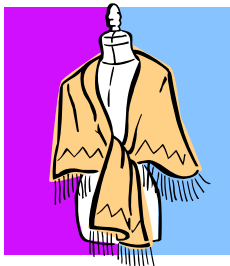
"Death... Now What....?"

Help with Transition

A major renovation of the Fairport Apartments Senior Housing complex is underway that has a significant impact on the residents. During this project residents will be relocated for 8 to 10 weeks. Many residents do not have family in this area that can offer support during this time. Caring individuals or families are needed to follow a senior through the process as a "Transition Friend." The time commitment for a Transition Friend is approximately 4 months (January-April or March-June) The role of Transition Friend will vary depending on the individual and will include:

- A friend to take an interest in the senior person throughout the transition process
- A good listener to hear the concerns and anxieties associated with the transition process
- A cheerleader to encourage the resident through the various steps and keep the resident on track with tasks required
- A friend to keep in touch with the resident by phone or visits during their temporary absence from Fairport Apartments

Some Transition Friends may also want to help with:

- Packing unbreakable belongings which will go into storage
(professional packers will take care of the breakables)
- Packing the items which will go to the temporary location
- Transporting the senior and belongings to and from the temporary location
- Unpacking and setting up the senior in the temporary location

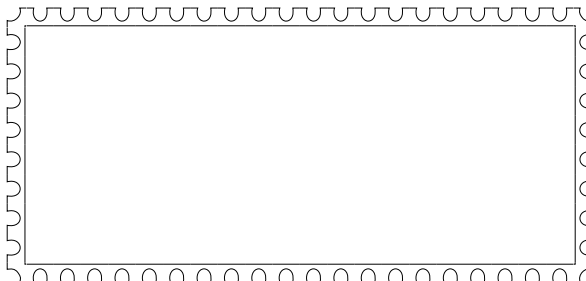
