## Joan's Jottings

Another Lent will soon be here. Ash Wednesday is February 22<sup>nd</sup> and Easter will be April 8<sup>th</sup>. Each of us is called to do penance during this Lenten season. Some years ago, the Church eased up on many of the regulations but each of us is still called to the practices **of fasting, prayer, almsgiving**. As in the past, the parish will be participating in Operation Rice Bowl and that adds the practice of **education**. All of these practices help us grow in self-discipline – not popular in today's culture. Satisfying one's needs and desires is what advertisers tell us. Lent reminds us that there is something more lasting and calls us to seriously undertake practices of self-discipline that help us respond to the ongoing call to conversion.

We are reminded on Ash Wednesday that we are dust and we will return to dust. Our lives here on earth will end one day but while we are still here, we need to examine our lives: where we've been, where we are right now, and where do we want to be. Change is never easy. We like to cling to the familiar and are hesitant to move towards the unfamiliar. As we travel along life's journey, we need one another for support and encouragement. But, we also need to be honest with ourselves and see where we need to change.

Again, I ask you to reflect on the forms of penance that the Church encourages us to do and then do what you can.

**Fasting:** During Lent, there are only two days to fast for those 21 years to 59 years old – Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. But there are other forms of fasting – fast from the sarcastic remark or flip comment, the unkind word; fast from doing what I want to do and going along with what another wants; fast from using my cell phone for an hour or not texting for a period of time.

**Prayer:** Prayer is necessary for one's spiritual life and is a great source of strength and comfort in our daily lives. While it is good if one can find a prayer time – a few minutes of quiet, one can also pray while driving, waiting for the traffic light to change, or while standing in the checkout line at the store. Prayer can be done any time, anywhere. Just do it! It will improve your life and your disposition!

**Almsgiving:** Operation Rice Bowl has been an annual project for many Lents. Materials are available in the church. But then you may have your own special charities or causes that you contribute to. Can you increase what you've done so that it is a sacrifice? We all know how difficult these times are with layoffs, cutbacks, and reduction in programs. If you can help out in some way, please do so.

**Education:** We all need to continue to grow in learning and understanding. Perhaps there's a book you've wanted to read or you want to help your children learn about other people and countries. Reading the Scriptures, a spiritual book or magazine will help you grow in understanding your faith. Remember to use the *Little Black Book* or *At Home with the Word* as part of your learning and prayer.

During Lent we don't need to do extra-ordinary things but we can do better the practices we should be doing. Welcome to another Lent!

# STEPHEN MINISTRY



*Dear Parishioners of Church of the Resurrection,*

In the devotional book [\*Seize the Day with Dietrich Bonhoeffer\*](#), Charles Ringma shares this quote from Bonhoeffer:

*"The disciple-community does not shake off sorrow as though it were of no concern of its own, but willingly bears it."*

Then Ringma comments:

*Martin Luther translated "Blessed are those who mourn" to mean "Blessed are those who are the sorrow-bearers." As Christians, we not only have our own sorrows and burdens to bear, but also those of others. In practice, this means that we take other people's tragedies and difficulties to our own hearts in intercessory prayer and in helpful service. In adopting this ministry, we ourselves will also be comforted.*

This immediately made me think of two dimensions of Stephen Ministry.

First, Stephen Ministers are *sorrow-bearers*. They are not sorrow-fixers, sorrow-brighteners, or sorrow-deniers. They come alongside a hurting person to listen, care, support, pray, empathize, encourage--to bear another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2). And through their sorrow-bearing, God brings about real, lasting healing.

Second, an effective sorrow-bearer remains connected to Jesus, who "took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows" (Isaiah 53:4). Jesus, incarnate in you, empowers you to be a sorrow-bearer. He makes sorrow-bearing possible--and powerful.

Whether or not you are involved in Stephen Ministry, you probably won't have to look hard for opportunities to be a sorrow-bearer, because they'll come looking for you. Welcome them. By sharing people's burdens so that God's healing love can flow through you to those who are hurting, you'll make a real difference in people's lives--and your own life will be immensely enriched as well.

**Ash Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>**, ashes will be distributed during the Masses at 8:30am and 7:00pm. *Remember you are dust and to dust you will return.*

### Guidelines for Fast and Abstinence

1. Ash Wednesdays and all Fridays of Lent are **days of abstinence** (no meat) for persons 14 years and older.
2. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are **days of fasting**.
3. All persons between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound by the law of fasting.
4. Catholics are encouraged to perform acts of penance regularly, especially during Lent.

**Don't know what to do with your old palm?** Bring it to church and place it in the box at one of the entrances by February 12<sup>th</sup>. The palm will be burned for Ash Wednesday.

- **Little Black Book for Lent** for each household is available the weekend of February 18/19.
- **Lenten Penance Services** are Monday, March 26<sup>th</sup>, 11:30am and 7:00pm.

**Individual Confessions:** every Saturday from 4:00-4:30pm (except April 7).

**Holy Week:** March 31/April 1 - Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion – regular weekend schedule

- Tuesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, Chrism Mass at Sacred Heart Cathedral, 7:30pm.
- Holy Thursday, April 5<sup>th</sup>, Mass of the Lord's Supper, 7:00pm  
Private Adoration in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel from 8:00-11:00pm.  
Night Prayer, 11:00pm.
- Good Friday, April 6<sup>th</sup>, 3:00pm, Celebration of the Lord's Passion

## DIOCESAN-WIDE PARISH-BASED ADVOCACY PUBLIC POLICY WEEKEND FEBRUARY 11/12, 2012 In the Image of God: Access to Mental Health Care

"[The Church] . . . reminds the political community of its duty to recognize and celebrate the divine image in man with actions that support and serve all those who find themselves in a condition of serious mental illness. This is a task which science and faith, medicine and pastoral care, professional skills and a sense of solidarity must help to carry out through an investment of adequate human, scientific, and socio-economic resources . . ."

Pope John Paul II, Nov. 1996

Our faith is centered in the belief that each of us reflects the grace and goodness of God. Yet those among us suffering from **mental illness** are often denied the **dignity due them**. In the coming year, our Diocesan Public Policy Committee is asking us to consider the challenges facing individuals as they live with depression, anxiety, and other mental and emotional disorders. In particular we are asked to consider the **situation of young people**. In many areas of our diocese, mental health treatment for children is scarce. Desperate parents are forced to travel long distances, sometimes out of state, to seek the care their children need. There are approximately one million children in New York State with emotional, behavioral, or substance abuse disorders. Yet on average only 20% of children and adolescents with psychiatric disorders in the U.S. receive mental health treatment.

This shortage of mental health care providers for young people is a result of a variety of factors - a lower-than-average salary for child psychiatrists compared to other medical specialties, a persistent stigma associated with mental illness, low reimbursement rates, and disparities in funding for graduate students

There are two educational topics this year from the Diocesan Public Policy Committee: Releasing Captives from Bondage: Sex Trafficking and The Common Good; We are One in the Body of Christ: Poverty in the United States and in our Diocese.

## LOOKING FOR AND NEEDING VOLUNTEER HELP!

*The Dimitri House is looking for volunteer help for their winter men's shelter program. We have had parish members volunteer there since its founding in 1995 through Corpus Christi parish. The house is no longer parish sponsored but could use some help. See the info below for an idea of the house's programs.*

*Dimitri Mamczur was the inspiration for Dimitri House. . . .Dimitri owned no house, drove no car, held no bank account, and yet Dimitri was rich ..... rich in the eyes of God.*

**Men's Emergency Winter Shelter: The seven bed shelter is open from November through April, seven nights per week. All the comforts of home are provided- comfy beds, clean bedding, showers, laundry facilities, a light meal in the evening and a hearty breakfast in the morning. Guests arrive at 9:30 in the evening and leave at 7:00 am. They have the opportunity to stay for an extended period of time in order to 'get back on track'.**

**The Men's Emergency Winter Shelter has the following volunteer opportunities are available:**

Greeter- The responsibilities of the greeter are to welcome the shelter guests into the house and check their identification. If there is an overflow of guests, it is the greeter's job to find other housing for overflow guests. The greeter makes coffee and prepares a small snack for the men. It's good to check the shelter log so as to be familiar with the men who are staying at Dimitri House and to check for messages or notes left by staff. Start at 8:30 pm leave when MOHs arrive.

Ministers of Hospitality- The responsibilities of the ministers of hospitality (MOHs) are to engage in conversation with the men during the evening and then to see to it that all men are in bed by 11:00 pm and lights are out. In the morning, wake early, make coffee and breakfast. Wake guests at 6:00 a.m. serve breakfast and clean up. Guests and MOHs leave by 7:00 am.

## What Is La Casa?

**DESCRIPTION:** La Casa is a transitional housing program for migrant farm workers in Wayne County. Located in Sodus, La Casa can house up to 14 persons at one time, offering lodging to farm workers and their families. Farm workers can need short-term housing when grower-provided housing is unavailable or when health issues prevent a laborer from returning to work, to name a few examples. The typical stay at La Casa can last from 60 to 90 days.

La Casa helps its residents find more permanent housing and makes referrals to health, education and social services. A food pantry is available at La Casa for emergency food needs of residents. La Casa also advocates on behalf of the migrant farm worker community, seeking to obtain fair treatment and to promote legislation that will provide migrant farm workers with a legal status that best serves them, the people that employ them and the surrounding community.

**STAFF:** The services of La Casa are coordinated by Peter Mares, who is fluent in both English and Spanish. La Casa also benefits from the active support of numerous volunteers who paint, landscape, make repairs and provide other services of value to La Casa residents.

**FUNDING:** the majority of funding for La Casa is currently provided by the Diocese of Rochester. La Casa receives donations from individuals, churches and other community groups. Emergency food is supplied by Food link Food Bank. In addition, residents of La Casa frequently contribute to the cost of operating La Casa.

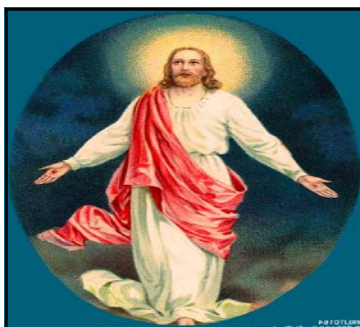

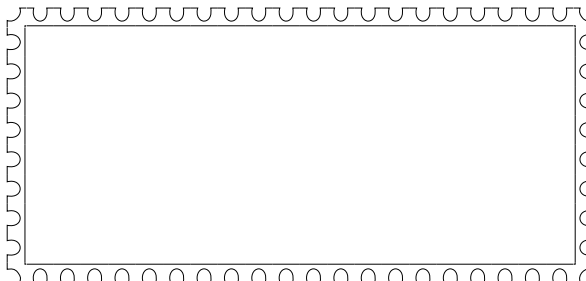
