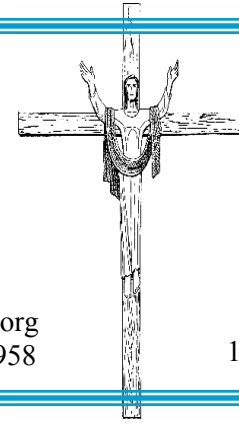

## **Staff Reflections—Jan Harmon**

“I should like you to be free of anxieties,” St. Paul tells the Corinthians in today’s reading. When you heard this, was your immediate reaction, “I would, too?”

If we allow them to run rampant, our minds can cause us to be anxious about a myriad of things: Am I being a good parent? Can I afford the time and money necessary for the activities and sports teams my children want to be involved in? What are too many things? What are the best colleges for my children? Can they really afford to go there? Should I find a second job to help pay the bills? Am I going to be downsized? Will there be enough money available when I want to retire? Will this vehicle last until we can afford to buy another one? Why do our family gatherings always end up in arguments? Why does Dad have to suffer with cancer? Will the United States ever be attacked? Will our elected officials ever get our country back on track as the greatest country in the world? What will happen after the 2012 elections? Where is God in the chaos of my life? How do I get off this merry-go-round?

Simplistic as it appears, St. Paul provides the antidote in his letter to his beloved Philippians: “Be anxious for nothing, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.” (4:6)

In the Gospel according to Luke, Jesus asks, “Can any of you by worrying add a moment to your life-span? If even the smallest things are beyond your control, why are you anxious about the rest?” (12:25-26)

The reality is that worrying comes naturally to almost everyone. What we need to come to terms with is that, left to our own devices, we do not always have the best solutions, and sometimes our incessant worrying can transform a small concern into a monstrosity. Our heavenly Father, however, is well aware of what is missing in our lives. We should go to Him throughout our day, asking for guidance, discernment, good judgment. It can also be extremely helpful to have someone walk alongside us when struggling. Choose a close friend, seek out a Spiritual Director, call our Stephen Ministry hotline. We were never meant to be alone. Find what is most effective for you so that you can experience the peace that God desires for each of us.

**A Stewardship Moment** – In today’s Gospel, we hear proclaimed the beginning of Jesus’ public ministry. He teaches. He heals. All are amazed. By their baptism, Christian stewards realize they are called to do the same in their lives. They are called to be the light of Christ each day. As we bring closure to the beginning of this new year, now is a good time to ask the Lord to fill our hearts with courage and faith, so that we too may publicly minister in his name; that we may be liberated from our insecurities and fears so that we can share the Gospel authoritatively and work to heal at least one wounded relationship in the coming months.
